


Check out 2-1-1 Helpline's new search engine! Anyone can access the search feature by going to the <u>IHS website page</u> or by the below URL.



Step 1: create a login Note: even if you get an error message after verifying, you should still be able to login with the username and password that was just created


## **Step 2:** start searching Example: "food pantries, 14830, 30 mile"



## Tax Programs

A message from 2-1-1 Helpline of the Finger Lakes and Arbor Housing

The Southern Tier CA\$H (Creating Assets, Savings and Hope) Program is officially closed. However, 2-1-1 Helpline of the Finger Lakes and Arbor Housing and Development is still committed to providing access to tax support throughout the Southern Tier.

United Way offers a free online filing service that you can use anywhere. MyFreeTaxes.com is a tool (H&R Block software) for people who made \$66,000 or less in combined Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) in 2018.

You can prepare and file both federal and state taxes at no cost, and claim valuable tax credits like the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC).

# Improve Safety at Nonprofits at Risk of Hate Crimes and Attacks

Governor Hochul announced the opening of applications for \$50 million to strengthen safety and security measures at nonprofit, community-based organizations at risk of hate crimes or attacks because of their ideology, beliefs, or mission.

This funding is the greatest amount ever available through the program. Nonprofit organizations that have previously received grants may now apply for new security projects, and for the first time, cybersecurity projects will be considered for funding.

Additionally, Governor Hochul announced \$46 million in federal funding for 240 nonprofit organizations across the state facing an increased risk of terrorist attack. This critical funding will assist in strengthening the security of their facilities, as well as enhance overall preparedness.

Applications must be submitted by noon on Tuesday, Feb. 28, 2023.

# January is National Human Trafficking Prevention Month

**Catholic Charities Chemung & Schuyler** 



ELMIRA, NY – January is National Human Trafficking Prevention Month and our local Safe Harbour Programs are asking for your help recognizing human trafficking in our local community.

Human trafficking is a crime involving the exploitation of someone for the purposes of compelled labor or a commercial sex act through the use of force, fraud, or coercion. Human trafficking affects individuals across the world, including here in the United States, and is commonly regarded as one of the most pressing human rights issues of our time. Human trafficking affects every community in the United States across age, gender, ethnicity, and socio-economic backgrounds.

Locally, Catholic Charities, in partnership with the Schuyler County Youth Bureau, operates the Runaway and Homeless Youth Program and the Safe Harbour Program serving anyone 10-24 years old who has run away, is at risk of running away or has been a victim of human trafficking. The local 24-hour hotline

can be reached by calling or texting 607-742-9629 at any time. A website with resources and help can be found at <u>SafeHarbourHelp.org</u>.

In Chemung County, the Safe Harbour program is offered through a partnership between the New York State Office of Children and Family Services and Chemung County. Safe Harbour works to address human trafficking by providing education and services to youth at risk of becoming victims, or those who have been confirmed to be victims, of exploitation. There is a concentrated effort to increase community awareness on what human trafficking looks like in our local community, how to identify potential victims, and how to prevent youth from being exploited. 
