# Grant Opportunity

### Mary Vohar Lilley Community Impact Grants

The American Heart Association invites organizations in need of Cardiac Emergency Response Planning (CERP) and AED placement in Steuben County and surrounding communities to apply to the <u>Mary Vohar Lilley Community Impact Grants</u> as part of the Association's mission to create a nation of Heartsavers. A Cardiac Emergency Response Plan is a written document that establishes the specific steps to reduce death from cardiac arrest in any setting – be it a school, community organization, workplace, or sports facility. Only about 40% of people who experience an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest receive the immediate help that they need before professional help arrives. When a person has a cardiac arrest, survival depends on immediately receiving CPR from someone nearby. Immediate CPR and use of an AED can **double, or even triple**, survival rates.


**Community Response (CPR):** Proposals to include a focus on intervention strategies including early recognition and initiation of CPR and appropriate use of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs). Proposals must demonstrate a community driven approach and community representation in planning and execution. Organizations applying for an AED placement grant must also be able to commit to the development of a Cardiac Emergency Response Plan (CERP) and training designated safety staff.

Priority will be given to proposals that directly benefit the City of Corning, NY and Steuben County. All funds from Mary Vohar Lilley Community Impact Grants are restricted for use within Steuben County, Allegany County, Chemung County, Schuyler County, Yates County, and Livingston County. Applicants must have 501(c)(3) status or have a partner 501(c)(3) organization that agrees to be the fiscal agent for the Community Impact Grant. If you have any




